Lopez was an active member of the Indian Welfare Association, and well known in the Smith River area. He also served as a guide for many fishermen on the Smith River.

Funeral services were held Saturday from Roeder Funeral Home, with Rev. Weldon Mickle officiating. Internment was in Smith River cemetery.
