LEGAL NOTICE

PROCLAMATION: - WHEREAS, the unregulated use of certain forest areas is, in the judgment of the State Forester due to conditions tending to cause or allow the rapid spread of fires which might occur or because of the inaccessible character of such areas due to the lack of suitable roads and WHEREAS, upon the showing of the State Forester it appears to me to be necessary to close to unregulated use the following areas designated as: **AREA NO. B-1: ALL of the following National Forests in Oregon and adjacent areas protected by the United States Forest Service, as follows:** Adjacent to Siskiyou National Forest: Section 31, T. 32 S., R. 8 W.; Section 36, T. 32 S., R. A W.; Section 36, T. 33 S., R. 8 W.; Section 36, T. 34 S., R. 8 W.; Sections 7, 8, 9, 16, 17, 18, 19, 30 31, T. 34 S., R. 11 W.; Section 36, T. 34 S., R. 13 W.; Section 36, T. 35 S., R. 8 W.; Sections 6, 7, 16 to 20 inclusive, 29 and 30, T. 35 S., R. 11 W.; Section 17, Sections 20, 29, 30, and 31 T. 35 S., R. 12 W.; Sections 4, 8, 9, 16 17 and 18, T. 39 S., R. 12 W.; and those portions of Sections 1 and 12, T. 40 S., R. 7 W. lying east of Sucker Creek; Sections 3, 10, T. 41 S., R. 8 W.; Section 16, T. 41 S., R. 11 W.; Section 16, T. 41 S.; R. 12 W. NOW, THEREFORE, I, PAUL L. PATTERSON, Governor of the State of Oregon, by virtue of the authority vested in me under the provisions of Section 477.158, Oregon Forest Laws, 1954, do hereby proclaim the unregulated use of the above-described areas to be unlawful and do hereby close said areas and the same shall be subject to use only upon condition that entrants shall comply with all of the following requirements or conditions: (1) To refrain from smoking while traveling in such areas. (2) To secure a permit issued by the forester of a fire warden before building a campfire other than at improved, designated and posted campgrounds on such areas. (3) To have as a part of his or her equipment when using campfires, except when traveling as a pedestrian and/or camping at improved, designated and posted campgrounds, tools, as specified by the forester suitable for extinguishing fires. This proclamation shall be effective from and after the 30th day of June, 1954, and shall remain in full force and effect until and including the 31st day of December 1954. Done at the Capitol in Salem, Oregon, this 25th day of June, 1954.

National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 P. M., PST, August 3, 1954, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 186 acres within Section 29, 30 & 32, T. 40S., R.12 W., W. M., Wheeler Creek watershed a tributary of the Winchuck River and the Jack Creek watershed a tributary of the Chetco River, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 6,442,000 bd ft., more or less, of Douglas-fir, 160,000 bd. ft., more or less, of western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. No bid of less than \$5.50 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir, and \$1.00 per M bd. ft. for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.30 per M bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$1.60 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. All timber under this contract must be cut and removed and all contractual requirements met by December 31, 1956. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor prior to 2:00 P. M., PST, August 3, 1954. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$8000.00 must accompany each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained in part as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Brookings, Oregon, before bids are submitted. On Monday, July 19, at 9:00 A. M., a forest officer will be available at the Brookings Ranger Station, Brookings, Oregon to explain the conditions of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.

News From The County Agent

Douglas, Coos and Curry County Extension Agents to hold Counsellors Training Camp the week end of July 17, and 18 near the Geisell Monument State Park, says Mrs. Sylvia Lee, Home Agent in Curry County. This pre-training camp is essential for the 24 older 4-H members from the three counties who will assist the Agents in the various camp activities that is necessary for a well organized and conducted recreational program for the 4-H camp to follow July 26 through August 4.

The Curry County 4-H members to receive this camp counselling instruction are: Lois La-Clair, of Harbor; Vesper Bailor, Sharon Jarrett, and Joe Clyde of Gold Beach; Pat Kerber and Marcia Maconald of Port Orford; Wilbur Jensen of Denmark; Jeanette Thompson and Bobby Jean Sypher of Langlois. These 4-H members are acting leaders of younger 4-H members or are assisting an adult leader doing a specific leadership work, which gives them responsibility and understanding of other boys and girls.

Highlights of the counsellor's training program will be instruction on camp organization, such as assigning members to the right groups for playing and living together; conducting free hours; games; swimming; hiking field trips; camp fire programs and instructional and craft classes. The counsellors themselves will

handle the craft classes and the 4-H camper will be given a choice of which craft they wish to make.

Lois LaCrair will show them how to do metal embossing or tooling. There will be a few articles complete so that the camper can make his decision.

Vesper Bailor will have charge of a class on a cleverly made bur-lap bag on which the decorative effect can be very creative and excite the campers imagination to excess themselves as individuals.

Sharon Jarrett's special talent

will be to show how to make paper mache planters—the quick drying type. These articles can be decorated to please the individual too.

Then with the same equipment used in the previous mentioned crafts the three girls can show how to make decorative wooden covers. We call them lumber jackets.

The campers will sleep out under the stars and prepare their own meals and even be encouraged to attend the church of their choice on a Sunday.
