My answer was, quite naturally, "No, I've never needed a written invitation to call on any of my friends. Don't you go to your friends without a written invitation?" Admittedly, he does.

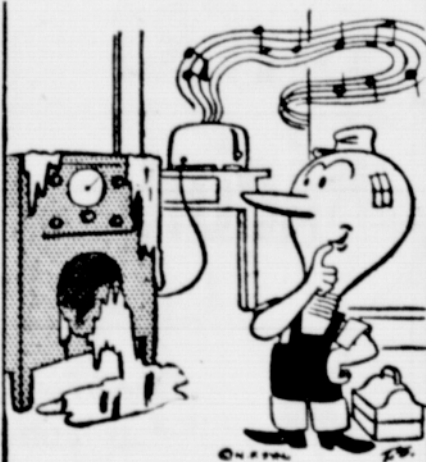
