

# BROOKINGS BEAVERS SPLIT TWO WITH GRANTS PASS CAVEMEN

The Brookings Beavers have finally shaken their long losing streak. They didn't win a double header at Grants Pass this past week-end, being nosed out again Saturday night, 2 to 1, for their 7th straight loss and 5th by the margin of one run, but it was an 8 to 5 victory on Sunday.

Even then it looked like this might be another one run defeat with the Cavemen leading 5 to 4 until the top of the 8th.

The Beavers exploded in that inning for 4 big runs, Jim Johnson, as first up drew a walk and Bob Selsor singled past third base. Frank Burdell was an infield out but Jim Kelly teased Rusty Martindale out of a base on balls on

3 and 2 count. This brought up Bob Astin who had been in a terrific batting slump. Astin proved he can still hit by poking a long single over short to score Johnson and Selsor Tony Troncale, playing 1st base for Len Reynoldson, also singled to left to bring in Kelly and Astin.

Brookings had scored one run in the 1st on Cliff Girod's walk, his two stolen bases and Selsor's hit. The Beavers added 3 more in the 2nd on Girod's 3-run homer. The Cavemen were meanwhile getting more than their share of base hits in the early innings.

They tagged Jim Barrett for a triple and a homer in the 1st, a single tally in the 2nd and 2 more in the 3rd with only one down.

The Saturday night tilt was another tough loss for Tony Troncale, his third low score defeat. The first was 1 to 0 at Coquille, then a 2 to 1 defeat by Drain and this one by the Cavemen, also 2 to 1. Bob Diller, the only pitcher in the league to beat Drain this season, was equally tough on the Beavers with 14 strike outs and 3 hits, one each by Lee Goodin, Frank Burdell and Bill McLean. Brookings managed an unearned run in the 5th to take a 1 to 0 lead but Grants Pass scored single runs in the 6th and 7th, just enough to win.

Brookings fans who have waited patiently for another home game will have an opportunity to see the Beavers in a double header against Coquille this coming Sunday afternoon. The first game is scheduled for 1 p. m. but may be delayed somewhat due to the Lily Festival parade.

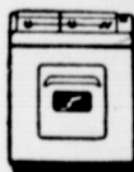

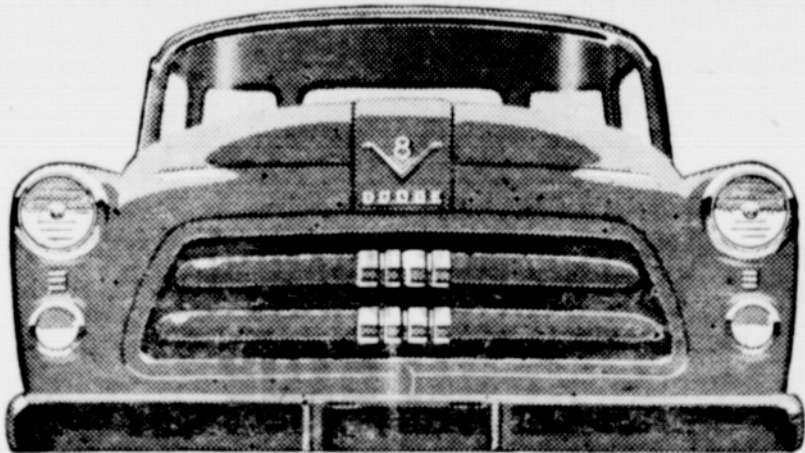
