Beach, Oregon.

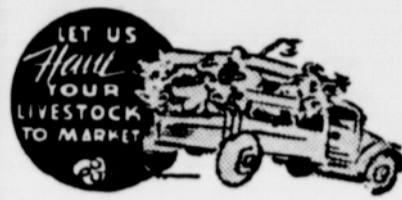
Buried in James Ward Memorial
