

Stiff Speeding Fines Stipulated By Law, DA Says

Stiff penalties which are for breaking the speed limit on county roads are mandatory under State law, District Attorney Sam Hall warned this week.

The penalties assessed for breaking the 25 mile per hour speed limit on county roads are a fifty dollar fine or 15 days in the county jail.

Hall issued his warning because of a widespread belief that penalties for speeding on county roads are discretionary with Justices in the county. Actually, Hall said, no Justice has the right to modify the mandatory sentence.

The heavy penalties have been prescribed because of the dust nuisance raised by speeding vehicles, and because of the damage caused to secondary roads by excessive speeds.

Holstein calf selection day will be a feature of the Oregon state fair on September 8. Don E. Anderson, Oregon State college extension dairy specialist, has announced.

The Oregon State Holstein association is offering registered calves to 4-H and F F A members or veterans of World War II. Applications for taking part in the selection day are due August 16. They are to be sent to Joe Rogers, Independence, chairman of the calf selection committee.

Prices, ranging from \$75 to \$200, will be set by Ben Simonson of the Oregon Dairy Breeders and a representative of Oregon State college dairy department.

To be eligible, 4-H members are required to have their applications signed by a county 4-H extension agent. F F A applications are to be signed by instructors. Veterans applications need the signature of a veteran's adminis-

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Crescent City Man Dies In County Jail

Robert W. Mays of Crescent City died Friday afternoon in the Curry County jail, at Gold Beach. A coroner's jury placed the cause as acute alcoholism, following an autopsy by Coroner Paul Ronniger.

Mays had been arrested Tuesday with a companion, Owen Luglan, following an automobile accident in Harbor. Both had appeared before Justice of the Peace, Mrs. Charles Schaal, where

they had pled guilty to being drunk on a public highway. Luglan, the suspected driver of the car, had been sentenced to a \$100 fine and fifty days in jail, and Mays a \$50.00 fine and 25 days in jail.

While in jail, Mays refused all food and became incoherent. He died about two P. M. Friday.
