

Juveniles Told To Watch Curfew

Curfew laws in the City of Brookings will be rigidly enforced, Chief of Police Bud Cross warned this week.

The law provides that every juvenile under 18 years of age must be off the streets by 10:30 P. M., unless accompanied by their parents or by some other responsible adult.

Chief Cross said that a wave of vandalism in this area could be directly attributed to juveniles who are not observing the curfew, and he said that stern measures will be taken to enforce it.

Growth of population in this area, he said, is making law enforcement a larger and larger problem, and juveniles are contributing to the problem.

Chief Cross called upon parents of local teen agers to aid in observation of the 10:30 curfew by their children.
