Oregon Driver Convictions Up Two Hundred %

Oregon drivers were convicted of 59,353 law violations during the first six months of 1954, driver license authorities reported Thursday.

Convictions for the same period last year numbered 29,409, but officials cautioned the increase does not necessarily mean drivers are violating laws more frequently. Much of the increase is due to improved court reporting of convictions to the state department, they explained.

Included in the six-month report was a listing of driver license suspensions. Heading the list was driving while intoxicated which resulted in 1,415 suspensions. Oregon law calls for mandatory suspension after court conviction of drunk driving.

Another 1,124 persons lost driving privileges on 134 miscellaneous traffic charges, including 292 for reckless driving; 237, failure to report an accident; 195, violation the basic rule; 49, driving record; 21, disregarding a signal; and 20, violation of instruction permit.

Seventy-nine licenses were cancelled due to violation of license provisions, withdrawal of parents consent, or court recommendation.
