32 Counties Share Predatory Allocation

Thirty-two counties will share in \$30,000 allocated by the state department of agriculture for predatory animal control in Oregon during the 1954-55 fiscal year.

Last year 31 counties participated.

Funds earmarked for each county will be available to the extent that counties appropriate matching funds for predatory animal control, which is conducted by the state in cooperation with the U. S. Fish and Wildlife Service.

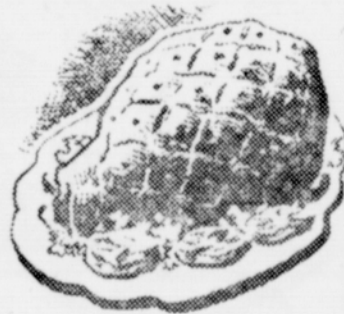
