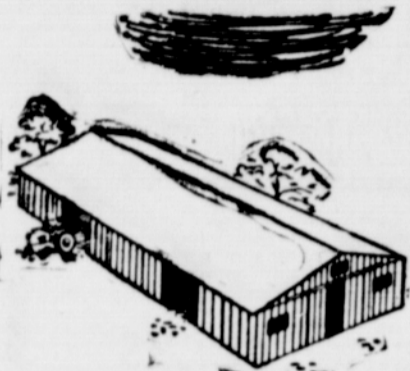

LIBRARY BOARD MEETS; REPORTS ON BUILDING PROGRESS, BOOK LOANING

At the recent annual meeting of the Library Board, all the officers were reelected excepting Frenchie Arrell, to whose place Ben Jones was elected. The nominating committee said the work in hand, they thought, would best proceed under the direction of those who had carried it this far.

M. S. Brainard reported lack of volunteers despite repeated calls and interruptions by festivals, that there was plenty of work for both men and women, and juveniles, experienced or not. The building, he said, was rough plumbed and wired, the roof on, and most of the shakes on the outside walls.

Mrs. "Dollie" Brainard, librarian, reported a sharp increase in both borrowers and circulation, sometimes loaning a hundred books a day. During the year, 250 adults and 165 children took out a total of 5,488 volumes, an increase of 25 per cent over the previous year, and a total stock of 1,547 volumes, with many more to be made available when more space can be had in the new building. Membership receipts amounted to \$105; rentals, \$31; Fines, \$52; Gifts, \$55.18. \$100.48 was spent for new books during the year.
