Earmark Million For Forest Fire Prevention Use

Well over \$1 million of federal funds has been earmarked for Oregon and Washington state forestry organizations to assist in the prevention, detection, and control of forest fires during the current fiscal year.

Oregon will receive \$591,056 and Washington \$541,227, the Forest Service announced today. Forty-one other states and the Territory of Hawaii receive federal fire control funds.

The federal-state cooperative program has been in existence since 1911. The objective of the original legislation, strengthened by the Clarke-McNary Act of 1924, is to assist in providing an adequate system of forest fire protection for private and other nonfederal timber lands. Funds appropriated by Congress are administered through the Forest Service to the states where direct expenditures are made by state forestry department.

Regional Forester J. Herbert

Stone pointed out that approximately 1/3 of the total annual timber cut in the nation is produced in Oregon and Washington. Protection of this valuable resource is essential to both local and national economies, he said.

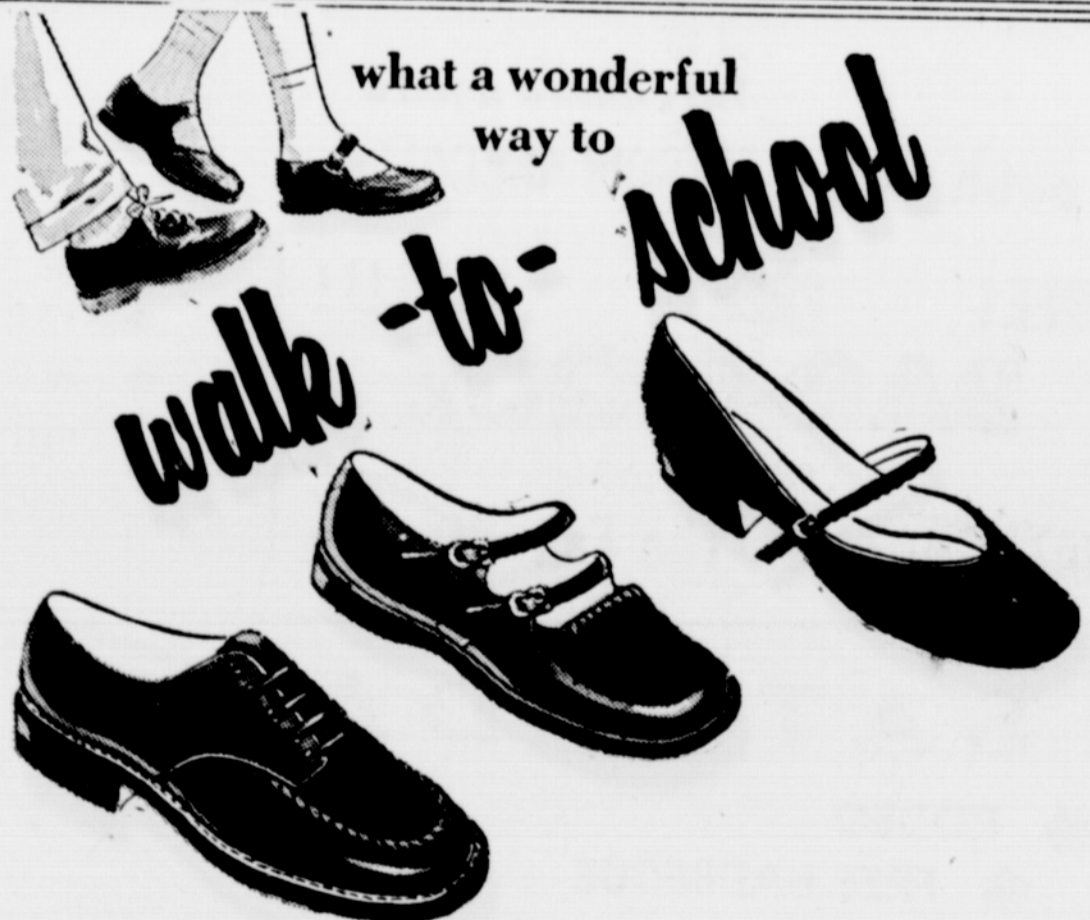
