Few people, even native, can place themselves at a precise point some 35 years ago and two people, at the same point, fewer still.

But Les Twohy and Warren Smith haven't forgotten February 8, 1918 and recently got together to hash over mutual memories before and after that date. Warren and Les, both of the 20th., Engineers, were aboard the liner TUSCANIA, en route to France, when that vessel was torpedoed by a German U boat, well off the Irish coast.

Through the medium of a local, nosey character, Les recently visited Warren, and during the long evening yet short one-found they had much more service in common, extending for many months from Washington, D. C., to several French billets, many mutual acquaintances of those days and yet never a direct contact.

Warren and Les still shiver in recollection of their long winter

pull in the North Atlantic, clad only in skimpy GI "skivvies."

Another local veteran of the same outfit is Bill Pate but neither Les and Warren have hooked up with Bill yet. The 20th., Engineers was a huge outfit, strung all over England and Europe.
