## Elks Contribute To Program For Handicapped

A check for \$5038 was given to the University of Oregon medical school this week by the Oregon State Elks association for continued support of the school's program for visually handicapped children, according to Pete Lesmeister, Exalted Ruler of the Brookings Elks Lodge.

Since the program was initiated in 1948, The Elks have contributed nearly \$68,000 to the school. The money has been used to maintain the children's eye clinic, to purchase modern examination equipment and to support research projects and teaching programs.

During the past six years nearly 4000 children from low income families have received diagnostic treatment services for serious eye conditions and more than 73,000 outpatient visits have been reported.

The local lodge paid a portion on a per capita basis for support of the program.

## COURTS CONVICT 9,956 DRIVERS

Oregon courts convicted 9,956 drivers of violating state traffic laws during July, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry reported today.

Among convictions reported were 274 for driving while intoxicated, an offense which calls for mandatory suspension of the driver's license after conviction.

Newbry said 140 other drivers lost licenses upon court recommendation for various traffic offenses, including 60 for reckless driving and 24 for violation of basic rule.

License officials suspended or cancelled 95 licenses for such actions as failure to report an accident, violation of license provisions, failure to pass tests, failure

to complete requirements and failure to appear for tests. Medical reports brought suspension of two licenses, and driving records with too-frequent accidents or violation convictions resulted in eight suspensions during the month.
