AGENCIES INVEST MILLION DOLLARS IN OSC RESEARCH

OREGON STATE COLLEGE—More than a million dollars is invested in scientific research at OSC this year by federal and private foundations and agencies.

Of the \$1,045,000, some 78 per cent, or \$822,000, comes from federal funds and the remaining 22 per cent, or \$223,000, from private sources. Funds go to the agricultural, forest and engineering experiment stations and the Science Research Institute at OSC. In its approximately 375 active research projects at OSC and the 13 branch experimental farms and stations, the agricultural experiment station studies such diverse problems as wheat smut, devel-

opment of new fruit varieties, nutrition studies of beef cattle and utilization of waste ocean fish. Some \$230,000 of the agricultural research money comes from federal funds and another \$170,000 from private gifts and grants.

Army, navy and air force granted OSC \$275,000 this year for work on 16 projects ranging from dehydration of green beans to molecular energy studies.

Atomic energy commission grants total more than \$194,000. Cyclotron construction claimed \$45,617. Other moneys went for such things as 2-4-D and vitamin amino acid research.

Bonneville power administration, state department and national science foundation contributed \$27,000 for four projects, including work on insect metabolism, electrical transmission lines, and electronic balancing of vegetables.

Fifteen private companies and research foundations gave OSC \$54,000 for 17 research projects. These funds are for research on chinchillas, mathematical methods, Northwest resources atlas and a variety of other projects.

Another research agency, Oregon Forest Products laboratory, operated by the state board of forestry, is located on the OSC campus.

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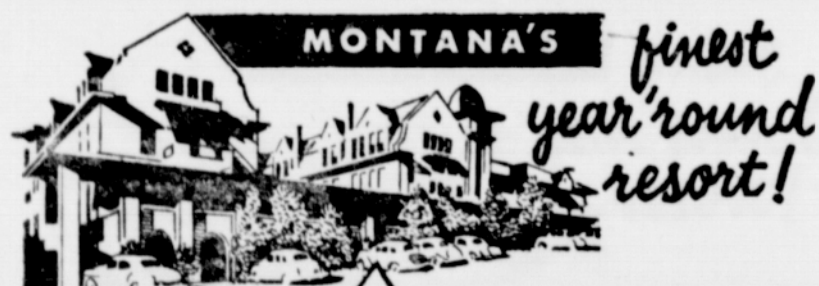
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
