## L. W. JOHNSON FINED IN COURT

L. W. (Larry) Johnson, Harbor, was found guilty to charges that he violated an Oregon state statute when he allowed his pigs to trespass on another's property because they were not fenced in.

A complaint against Johnson was filed in district attorney Sam Hall's office by Milton De Martin. De Martin charged that on August 9 of this year Johnson's pigs entered his garden and uprooted several square feet of his (De Martins) planted area.

The jury deliberated about ten minutes before arriving with the guilty verdict. They were unanimous in their verdict, but asked that leniency be shown Johnson and De Martin be reprimanded for not instructing Johnson, by written word, of the incident. Mr. Hall informed the jury that this had been acted upon but was not carried through because Johnson retrieved the pigs from the De Martin land.

Johnson acted as his own defense: and Hall was prosecuting attorney.

Mrs. Chas. Schaal, judge pro-tem, fined the defendant \$15.00 and costs.
