their possible entitlement to state of Oregon educational benefits while attending college or other accredited schools.

Raymond E. Petty, educational officer for the State Department of Veterans Affairs, said students should establish eligibility and file their application forms immediately with his office in order to avoid loss of the benefits.

Applications by mail should go to the Salem office in the State Library Building. They may be filed in person at either the Salem or Portland offices, or through county veterans' service officers. The necessary forms also are available at most schools.

State aid pays the veteran \$50 a month while enrolled in a full time, undergraduate college course, or \$35 a month for any other accredited course requiring 40 classroom hours of attendance monthly. Attendance of less than 40 hours pays at the rate of 87½ cents per classroom hour.

## Hill State Park Dedication, Sep. 23

The Louis W. Hill State Park at Cape Lookout is to be dedicated in special ceremonies on September 23, it has been announced by the Oregon State Parks Division. The park is located 12 miles southwest of Tillamook via the Netarts road.

This large area containing 175 acres was donated to the State of Oregon for park purposes by the Hill estate and contains most of the camping area. It adjoins Cape Lookout State Park.

Members of the Hill family will be honored at a luncheon at noon preceding the public ceremonies to begin at the park at 1:15 p. m. State, Tillamook County and other dignitaries are to be on hand to take part in the dedication. Announcements are to be made later of the complete program.

To qualify, the veteran must have been an Oregon resident for one year or more prior to his World War II or Korean service. The Korean veteran must actually have served in Korea. Service in either war must have been for at least six months, and discharge must have been honorable. The benefit is paid for as many months as the veteran spent in service, to a maximum of 36 months.

State aid is not payable at the same time the veteran is receiving federal GI educational benefits, nor is it payable for correspondents or hobby courses. There is no deadline, either for World War II or Korean veterans.
