

REDWOOD TANK, LOCAL LANDMARK IS TORN DOWN BY WATER CREW

Another Brookings landmark, has passed into local oblivion. This past week the much moved, huge redwood tank, which long served the community, was torn down by Elmer Bankus's crew, at the behest of Mrs. Palm Stout, upon whose back yard it had stood, for many years, and really became a menace of decay though the staves themselves, of firm redwood, are probably salvagable.

Arthur Driskell says the tank stood on the old millsite, not far from where the present huge plywood is located, storing clean water not only for the town but for the boilers. Later, it was moved up on top of Moore's Knob, serving the same purpose. Moore's Knob is the partly erased elevation just west of the Mobil gas station. From there, the tank was again shifted to the place so many of us remember, and again, for many, many years, was the

reservoir of the whole town and the guage upon its townsite side, was frequently consulted by the worriers, especially late in the summer, as a measure of their prospect for life and safety from fires until the winted rains came. Water was then pumped to it from Ransom Creek.

One wonders what its next resting place will be and many, many people, some many, many miles from here, are just enough sentimental about it to hope that it will continue its destiny of sustaining life and industry as faithfully as it has done in Brookings.

GOETZ WINS FIRST SALMON DERBY

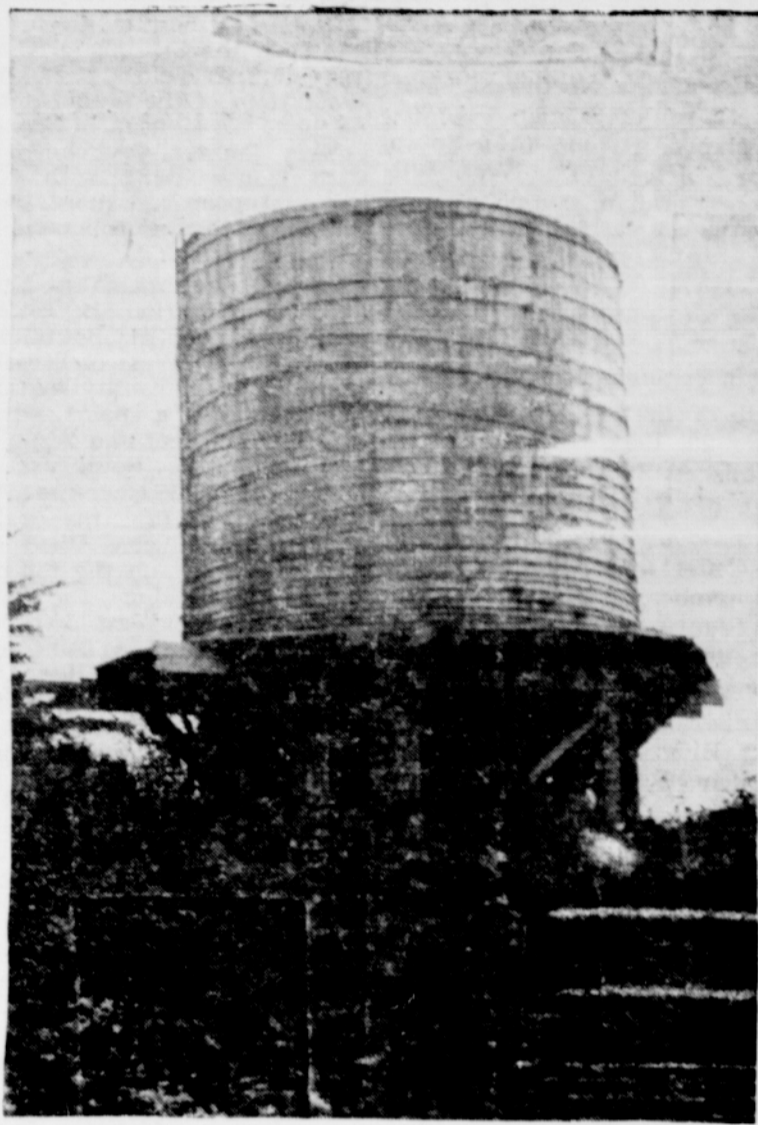

First week's winner in the Chetco American Legion post's Salmon Derby was Gordon Goetz, who hauled in a 20 lb., 10 oz. fish. Goetz was awarded the first prize for the week, which was a Penn 60 reel, donated by Hewitts anchorage.

According to word received from the anchorage, other good size fish have been taken already this week, although fishing in general has been a little slow. Marge Cummings brought in a 24 pounder, while Helen Rice hooked a 23 1/2 salmon.

A report from other sources told of several other large ones being taken, but they weren't officially weighed in at Hewitts which is the official station for the Chetco Salmon derby.

This week's prize will be awarded by Hanscam's store in Harbor, and it will be a 10 foot Long John spinning rod.
