ed in south western Oregon when load studies showed growth possibilities for which contemplated federal and private utility projects did not afford a satisfactory long term solution.

Southwestern Oregon is at the extreme long transmission lines, and for this reason could bear the brunt of any future power shortages.

Interest in generation possibilities was prodded into action by the swiftly rising demand for power in southwestern Oregon, coupled with the dearth of new starts on the Columbia and the urging of the President and other spokesman for the Administration that all utilities, public and private should try to solve their power problems locally.

The Bald Mountain project appears at this time to be the most feasible to develop. President Laird stated that no solution to the financing of the project has been found as yet, but is confident that if the idea proves as sound as preliminary surveys indicate, the financing can be accomplished.

The purpose of a preliminary permit is to enable the applicant to preserve priority rights against other potential applicants while engineering studies are being completed. Actual start on construction is neither contemplated nor legally possible at this time. If permission is obtained and suitable financing arrangements completed it would be possible to have power flowing from the project before 1960.

The dam itself would be in Josephine county, but everything else, including transmission lines, would be in Curry county.
