The Brookings city Planning Commission met Tuesday night to hold a hearing on the A. S. Lassard petition for rezoning. The petition asks permission to rezone what is now a retail site into a retail and light manufacturing site.

The Commission also were petitioned by the Bolvi and Foster of the Richfield station for the installation of a truck servicing and greasing station at their present location.

Another petition heard was one by the Brookings Milling Co. who applied for permission to operate a portable saw mill for seven months.

A fourth petition was presented by representatives of the Presbyterian church for the vacating of Fir st. and an alley so that they can begin work on a new church building.

The Commission will consider the four petitions and make a final report, which will be presented to the Council at its regular meeting next Tuesday.
