the incumbent Jap Yoakam, with the total finally completed. Breedlove was unexpectedly strong throughout the 10 precincts reporting, piling up a 205 vote margin in Port Orford, and a 57 margin in Sixes, his home grounds. Total reported was 1309 Breedlove, 1288 for Yoakam.

Another battle was for county surveyor, with the present surveyor Charles Echols getting beaten out by a newcomer, Arthur Sherman. Sherman piled up a heavy majority in the three southern precincts, which Echols couldn't overcome in the northern half of the county. Results in showed Sheman with 1368, and Echols with 1285.

Harbor, and the Chetco district slipped a referendum ballot in at the last minute, which most people and the local press wasn't aware of. It called for setting up a herd control law district, in which cattle would not be allowed to run loose.

It passed with 262 yes, and 46 no.

In the senatorial race which created a lot of attention here, and around the state, Sen. Guy Cordon pulled 1443 votes, com-

pared to Richard Neuberger's 1255. Gov. Paul Patterson showed his popularity here by piling up a 1628 vote, compared with his opponent Joe Carsons 1064. The Republican Eugene Allen barely nosed out Democrat Nilsen for Labor Commissioner here 1254 to 1192.

Rod McKenzie, Sixes, running for the state assembly; Sam Hall, Brookings, running for district attorney; Glenn Sabin, candidate for Sheriff, Bernard Mather, county treasurer, and E. W. Minty, Gold Beach all were running unopposed. Sabin, Gold Beach, piled up the largest number of votes in the county, totalling 2375.

Harris Ellsworth ran far ahead of his democratic opponent Charles Porter for congress, polling 1661 to only 998 for Porter.

The voting throughout the county was fairly heavy for an off year election. Voting averaged about 60 percent in most of the precincts.

Schaal Resigns As Justice of Peace

The resignation of Charlie Schaal, Harbor, as Justice of the Peace was announced this week. Schaal has been in ill health, and his wife had been filling into the Justice job pro tem.

Schaal was appointed as Justice of Peace about three years ago, and was re-elected to the post two years ago. His resignation becomes effective on Nov. 5.

There are four years remaining in the six year term of Justice of Peace.

Roy Brown, of the Brown Mortuary, has filed a petition with Gov. Paul Patterson, for the position. Patterson does the appointing in the Justice courts.
