LEAGUE OF CITIES VFW Post Here WRITE ON SEWERS Sends Bulbs Away

Mayor Bob Dimmick received some correspondence from the League of Oregon Cities this week concerning the recent notice sent out by the Brookings Land Townsite Co. charging residents a sewer service charge.

The letter, sent by Raymond C. Coulter, field consultant, of the league wrote the following opinion. He said "that ownership of the system was not in either the city or Mr. Bankus, but rather in the abutting owners of the sewer main."

"Upon that basis the Brookings Land and Townsite Co. would have no authority to impose such charges, or take any steps to enforce the collection of such charges."

Coulter also said that an attorney of the league, Ray Underwood had concurred with Brookings former city attorney, Sam Hall, on his opinion that the abutting property owners own the sewers.
