GARDEN CORNER

Bulb Planting

Get the spring-flowering bulbs in as soon as possible. They should have some time to set roots before severe weather comes. Tulips can go in now, or through November. Plant them 4 to 6 inches deep, depending on size of the bulb. Measurements should always be from the crown to ground level. Place a teaspoon of bonemeal in the base of each hole and cover it with an inch of sand or soil, then set the bulb and firm in the top soil. Should be 6 to 8 inches apart



Transplanting Time

Get all the transplanting done as early as it can be done, so that roots can become established before cold weather. The dryness of early fall prevented much of this work from being accomplished, but recent rains have dampened the ground sufficiently in most areas. If the soil is not soaked deeply, water the plants in.
