an estimated 50,000 will be planted this year.

The biggest winter job for the service is the location of roads and marking of timber sale areas. This work will continue all winter. They have begun work in the Wheeler Creek of the Winchuck drainage and in the Chetco River area.

There are three timber sales that will be ligged this winter on rocked roads. These winter sales are beneficial to the local

winter economy.

When not working out in the forest there are records to maintain and reports to send in. Bids are out now for construction of a 32 by 24 foot storage building to match the existing building.

The station here employs from two to twenty personnel, depending upon the season.

The Chetco district covers roughly an area to the California border on the south, nearly to the Illinois river on the east, and to the Rogue drainage on the north. The total Chetco District resources includes about

50,000 acres of merchantable timber—about 20 percent of the total.

Fifty thousand acres of the remaining are non-commercial land, too steep and rock to produce merchantable timber. However, the land is important as a watershed, and also for minerals.

Another 50,000 acres is stocked with pole size timber. This land

is growing wood every year, Ragland said.

And finally, 100,000 acres that because of frequent forest fires in the past has not become stocked with timber.

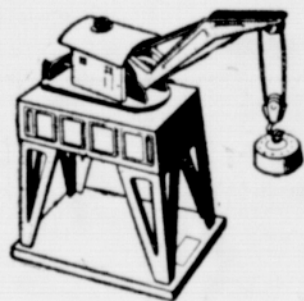
