filling the hydrant contract. It was brought out that he is about five hydrants behind. The city also decided to withhold their hydrant payment until Bankus appears to discuss the matter.

In a third step, aimed at Bankus, the city ordered all the bills presented paid, with the exception of the sewer bill sent for the first time this month. That bill was rejected with no discussion.

Other actions taken at the meeting included: passing an ordinance ordering the vacation of Fir St. so that the Presbyterian church can begin construction.

Balloting in the last election was also verified at the council meeting, and Roy Brimm was duly adjudged mayor, to take effect on January 1st.

The council okayed liquor licenses in the community with

some discussion after a report by police chief Bud Cross.

The citizens appeared before the council. Bob Phillips appeared to try to gain restitution for fill dumped on his property, and the city property adjacent to his, for which he was to get a bill.

Roy Brimm also asked the council that the city replace his corner stakes, so that he can know where his property line is. The city grader had knocked the stakes out.

And finally the council authorized payment to Roy Weideman for work done on Hillside Ave., when the funds are available, and directed city attorney Ed Ackley to write to the delinquent property owners in order to speed payment.
