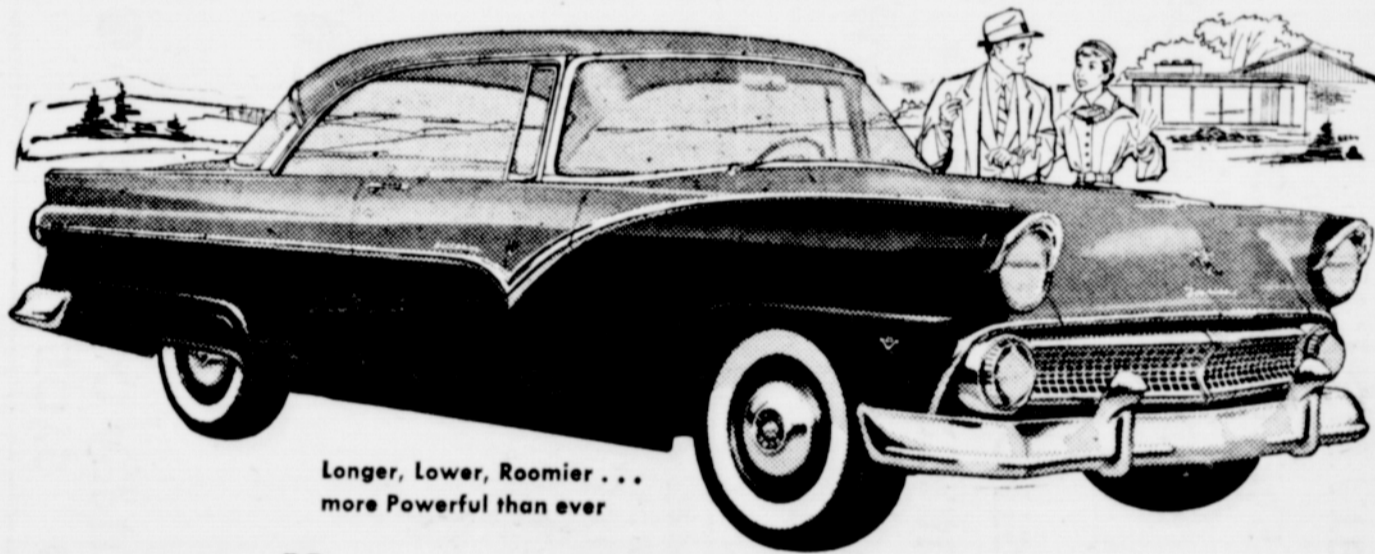
### Beta Sigma Phi Doll On Display

## Curry County Ninth In Oregon Log Cut

Curry County was ninth in the state of Oregon in millions of board feet of timber cut during 1953. A total of 348,428 MBF were cut during that year.

Total log production for the state is estimated at approximately 8.5 billion board feet, with Douglas County leading the way, with a cut of 1,495,316,000.

Oregon leads all the states in the union in volume of timber cut for the 16th consecutive year. But the '53 cut is 1.3 billion board feet under the record 9.8 billion feet cut in 1942.
