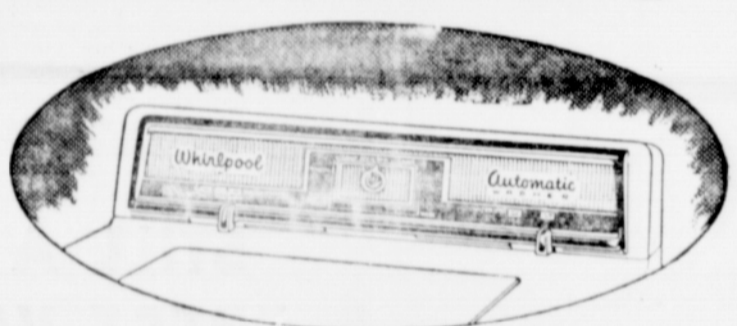

National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Regional Forester or his authorized representative at the office of the Forest Supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 2:00 P. M., January 4, 1955, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 574 acres within unsurveyed territory in T. 26S., R. 13W., and T. 37S., Rs. 12 & 13W., W. M., Juniper Creek and Lawson Creek watersheds, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon estimated to be 31,500 M bd. ft., more or less, of Douglas-fir and sugar pine, 2,000 M bd. ft., more or less, of Port Orford cedar, and 100 M bd. ft., more or less, of Western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. No bid. ft. less than \$12.20 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir and sugar pine, \$15.10 per M bd. ft., for Port Orford cedar, and \$1.00 per M bd. ft. for Western hemlock and other species will be

considered. In addition to the prices bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.30 per M bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.42 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest super-

view prior to 2:00 P. M., January 4, 1955. Sealed bids will be received for the information of all bidders, \$20,000.00 must be retained in part as liquidated damages; according to the conditions of sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form. The right to reject any and all bids is reserved. Forest Service bid forms for use in submit-

ting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of sale, and the submission of bids should be obtained from the Regional Forester, Portland, Oregon, the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Gold Beach, Oregon before bids are submitted. On December 14, at 8:30 A. M., a forest officer will be available at Gold Beach Ranger Station, Gold Beach, Oregon to explain the conditions of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.
