Sealed proposals for test drilling and for the construction of a deep well will be received by the City of Gold Beach, Curry County, Oregon, until eight o'clock p. m., P. S. T. on the 17th day of December, 1954, and will thereafter be publicly opened and read. Proposals shall be addressed to the City of Gold Beach, and mailed or delivered to the City Recorder, Ray P. Blankenheim.

The work includes drilling 6-inch-diameter test holes approximately 100 feet deep and test pumping, followed by construction of a cased 10-inch well suitably developed to produce approximately 200 gallons per minute.

Specifications may be examined at the office of the City Recorder or at Clark & Groff Engineers, 2245 South Commercial Street, Salem. Copies may be obtained upon deposit of \$5.00, which will be refunded upon return of the documents within 5 days from the date of the bid opening. Copies may also be obtained at the office of the Recorder in Gold Beach.

All proposals shall be made upon the regular blank forms bound with the specifications and shall be accompanied by a bid bond or certified check payable to the City of Gold Beach, in an amount equal to or exceeding 5 percent of the total bid, assuming one completed well 100 feet deep. The bid bond or certified check shall be forfeited to the City in the event of failure to contract within 5 days after acceptance of the bid.

The driller will be required to furnish evidence of his ability to perform the work desired, including equipment available and his experience in drilling wells of the desired capacity.
