

Footings Poured As Bank Building Gets Underway

Construction of the U. S. National bank's new Brookings branch building was started during the past week, with footing poured on Monday.

Completion is scheduled for some time in March, E. L. Morton, manager, announced.

The new building will be one story with mezzanine and is to be constructed of reinforced concrete with masonry facing.

Walk-up windows and customer parking area highlight the modern banking facilities planned for the new Brookings branch quarters.

"We have in our present lobby a large blowup of the architect's sketch", Morton stated, "so that our customers and friends can see just what we are planning for this area."

The new structure will be located on the Pacific Coast highway, approximately one block from the present building.

James S. HICKEY, Inc., holds the general contract and Irving G. Smith is architect.
