Release Budget Figure For State Park Department

The Oregon State Parks Division, Oregon State Highway Dept., will have available a \$1,194,000 budget for the maintenance development and operation of the state parks system during 1955. C. H. Armstrong, superintendent of the state parks, states that more than a third of the budget will be used in the operation of the parks, which includes the upkeep and maintenance of the public facilities enjoyed by the public. More than half will be used in development and new construction.

Armstrong said that usage in the parks have increased 112 per cent during a six-year period. The state parks superintendent anticipates that by 1964 Oregon parks will be operating for a total of 10,000,000 visitors. The division now administers 156 park areas containing 55,052 acres.

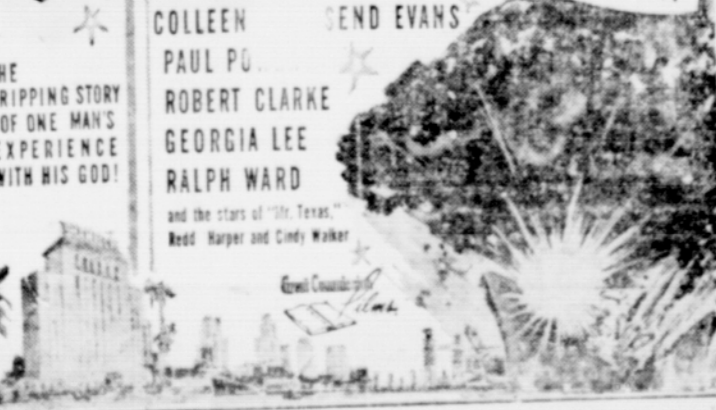
