

MANUFACTURING CENSUS IS DUE

A census report for manufacturers are being mailed to all state manufacturers by the Bureau of the Census. The last census of its type was taken in 1947. An estimated 275,000 firms will receive the forms throughout the U. S.

The top ranking manufacturing industries in Oregon, according to value added by manufacture, at the time of the 1947 census Sawmills and planing mills, with \$3,000,513,000, with Plywood plants running next with \$31,091,000.

The 1947 census showed 3,075 manufacturing establishments in Oregon with value added by manufacture of \$675 million, an average of 105,591 employees for the year.

Release Figures On Douglas Fir Production

Douglas fir industry production and shipment statistics for the first eleven months of 1954 were released today by Harris Smith, secretary of the West Coast Lumbermen's Association.

The weekly average of the West Coast lumber production in November was 202,193,000 b. f., 165.2% of the 1949-1953 average; Orders averaged 185,749,000 b. f.; Shipments 194,446,000 b. f.; Weekly averages for October were: Production, 212,643,000 b. f.; 116.6% of the 1949-1953 average; Orders 190,883,000 b. f.; Shipments 205,157,000 b. f.

Eleven months of 1954 cumulative production 8,573,336,000 b. f.; Eleven months of 1953, 9,558,685,000 b. f.; Eleven months of 1952, 9,340,678,000 b. f.

Orders for eleven months of 1954 breakdown as follows: Rail & Truck 6,242,368,000 b. f.; Domestic Cargo 1,663,584,000 b. f.; Local 329,016,000 b. f.

The industry's unfilled order file stood at 679,579,000 b. f. at the end of November, gross stocks at 888,492,000 b. f.

Figures covering the third quarter of 1954 have been adjusted to latest information available.
