BOWLING CLINIC PLANNED SAT. FOR BROOKINGS GRADE, HIGH KIDS

Strikes, spares and splits will replace reading, 'riting and 'rith-metic for the students of Brookings in the seventh, eighth grades and high school on Saturday, January 15 when a junior bowling clinic will be held at the Azalea Lanes beginning at 11 a. m. Conducting this class in the correct fundamentals of bowling will be Mrs. Mary Ann Wilson, Certified Instructor of the American Junior Bowling Congress from Medford. This instruction clinic will cover a two hour period and Mrs. Wilson will be assisted in her work by Mr. Ray Gadsberry.

With 46,000 of America's juniors, the American Junior Bowling Congress ranks as one of the Nations top juvenile recreation groups.

Following the group instructional period, each will get three shots at the head pin and if they hit it once, will receive a free game of bowling. Following this part of the period, each student will bowl a game, at which time Mrs. Wilson and her local assistants will give individual instruction to each as needed.
