Bruins Lose to Powers Team 83 to 58, Langlois Defeats Local Team Friday

A rangy, powerful Powers basketball team defeated the Brookings-Harbor high school team by sheer smart basketball play. The score was a humiliating 83 to 58, the game being played here at the local gym.

The day before the Bruins travelled to Langlois to receive another basketball lesson losing to the Panthers 75 to 53.

The Guthrie boys playing a Powers team loaded with boys 6 foot 2 and 6 foot 4 were no match right from the blowing of the first whistle until the gun sounded again at the end of the game. The Cruisers jumped to a 50 to 25 lead in the first half and coasted their way through the final stanza easily. Only in the third quarter, with some of the Powers first string riding the bench, did the Bruins threaten any. The local lads outscored their visitors in that period 21 to 10 and came within 14 points of the leaders. Frank Faddling, Ken Russell and Jerry Anderson each pumped in three baskets apiece to help stage the futile "rally". Powers was held to only two baskets then.

Faddling Leads Scoring

Frank Faddling, Bruin guard led the scoring for the night with 22 points netted on 8 baskets and 6 free tosses. Powers center, Spitznass was a close second with 21 points gained on the same number of baskets and 5 free throws. Ken Russell, leading scorer all season kept his average alive with 17 points.
