### Report Fishing Changes Small

First angling regulations for 1955 were agreed upon by the Oregon State Game Commission at a recent meeting.

Few changes were made in the tentative regulations as adopted a few weeks ago. Major changes included the re-establishing of the ruling requiring that fish over 14 inches in length be returned to the McKenzie river. This regulation will remain in effect during 1955.

Another change is that it will be legal to take whitefish in any water open for trout, steelhead, or salmon angling. There will be no bag or length limit on whitefish.

The commission also reported that their 50-page booklet describing completely the workings of the game commission is available for interested parties. It is the most complete general report of game commission activities that is available.
