Because of some mixup in scheduling, the Brookings-Harbor High School basketball game with Port Orford was not played as previously announced. The game, according to Coach Art Guthrie, was actually scheduled, but the Port Orford administrators felt they had not made any arrangements to that effect. It was reported by Supt. Lynn Hampton the game would be replayed Wednesday. The preliminary game starting at 7 p.m.
