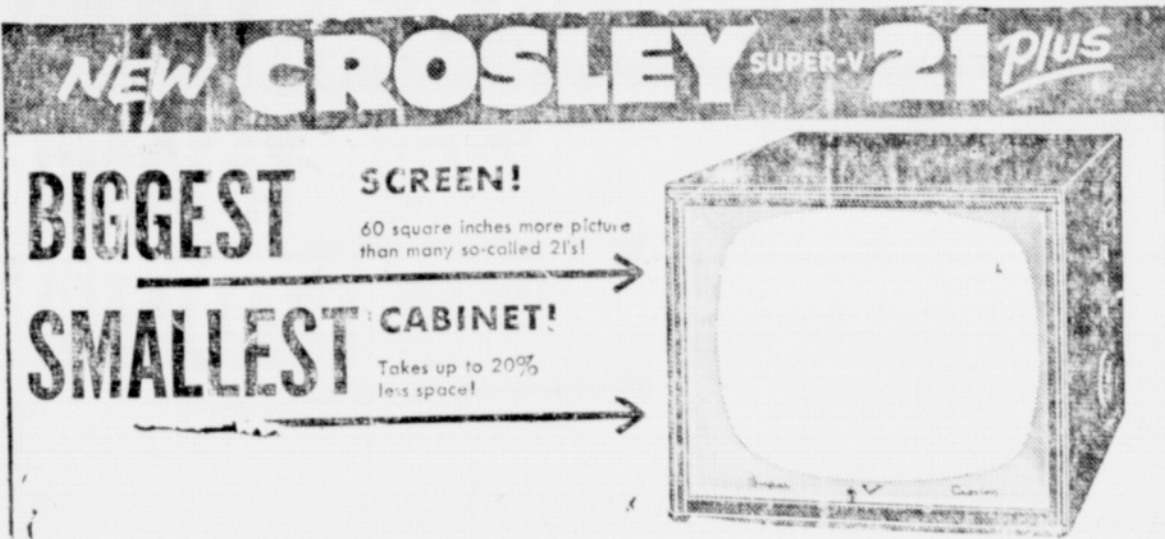

Talk of New Plywood Plant In Gold Beach

A new plywood mill has been proposed for Gold Beach, according to word received here from that city. The mill would employ up to 300, if the plans materialize. A group of timbermen, loggers, and plywood men held a meeting in Gold Beach last week to formulate plans for the mill, which would start with a large capacity green veneer plant, and then follow up with a finished-plywood plant.

Plans were to start construction in the near future on the plant and actual operation would begin in about 90 days. Exact location of the new mill was still in doubt but as it is in Wedderburn was thought to be the choice of several of the timbermen.

Two Gold Beach men, H. W. Crook and O. W. Bettis, who own and operate the Gold Beach Lumber Co. along with the Ocean View Lumber Company have been leading the discussions.

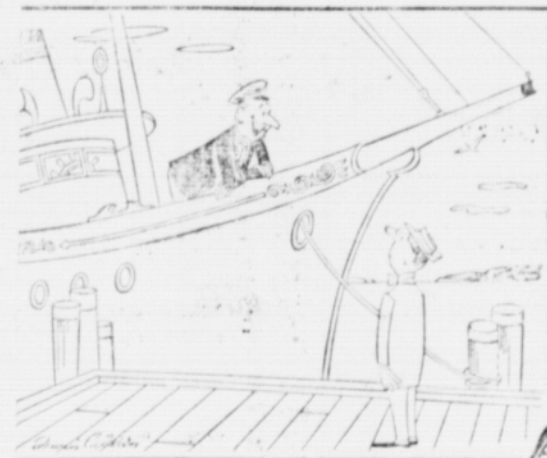
