Membership chairman, Mrs. James Maple, reported having received \$68.00 in renewals of memberships and \$2.00 for new members.

A letter from T. S. Easton of Dora was read, in which Mr. Easton proposed that the Association consider the matter of some kind of celebration of the Big Bend Battle which was fought between the Indians and the Whites in May 1846. The group considered favorably the suggestion and agreed that the matter would be taken up at a later meeting. It was proposed that an effort be made to locate descendants of those early tribes who participated. It may be added that an interesting amount of this event can be found in a chapter entitled "Indian Troubles" in the Coos-Curry History, "A Century of Progress." 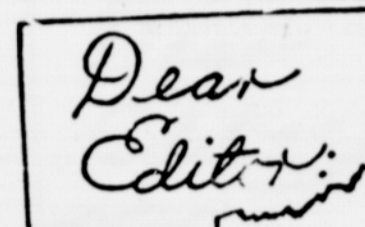
Hello World

\$5,800,000 Spent For Forest Protection In State

Nearly \$5,800,000 was spent during the year 1954 for the protection of the 12,000,000 acres of forest lands coming under the jurisdiction of the state forestry department and its cooperating forest protective associations, according to figures just released by State Forester George Spaur. The breakdown of the costs indicates that the logging operator and the timberland owner contributed \$4,750,000 of this total. The logger and the tree farmer put out \$3,000,000 as direct expenditures in snag falling, equipment purchase and additional patrol over and above that required under the regular protection provisions.

The balance of the private funds were contributed by the land owners through membership assessments to the various protective associations and through like assessments that were extended on the tax roll for collection.

The balance of approximately \$1,000,000 was made up of funds contributed through the state appropriation and contributions by the federal government as a grant in aid in the protection of state and privately owned forest lands.
