ACCIDENTS CLAIM 23 DURING FEB.

February traffic accident claimed 23 lives in Oregon, Secretary of State Earl T. Newby reported Friday.

This is approximately half the number of deaths charged to February traffic a year ago when 45 persons died.

Oregon's fatality count for the first two months of the year now stands at 50 compared with 67 recorded during the same period in 1954 with last month's reduction offsetting the death increase noted in January.

The lowered count came in the face of an increase of nearly seven percent in traffic volume. State Highway Department records indicate. Traffic volume records located throughout the state showed February traffic was up 6.9 percent.

Whether the state can improve its bettered death record or hold it further will depend on how well motorists meet the challenge of spring and summer driving conditions, Newby said. Fatal accidents normally increase as good weather encourages more open highway travel.

He said some drivers tend to relax their winter-time caution too soon and fail to adjust their thinking to the higher speeds at which traffic moves when road and weather conditions improve.

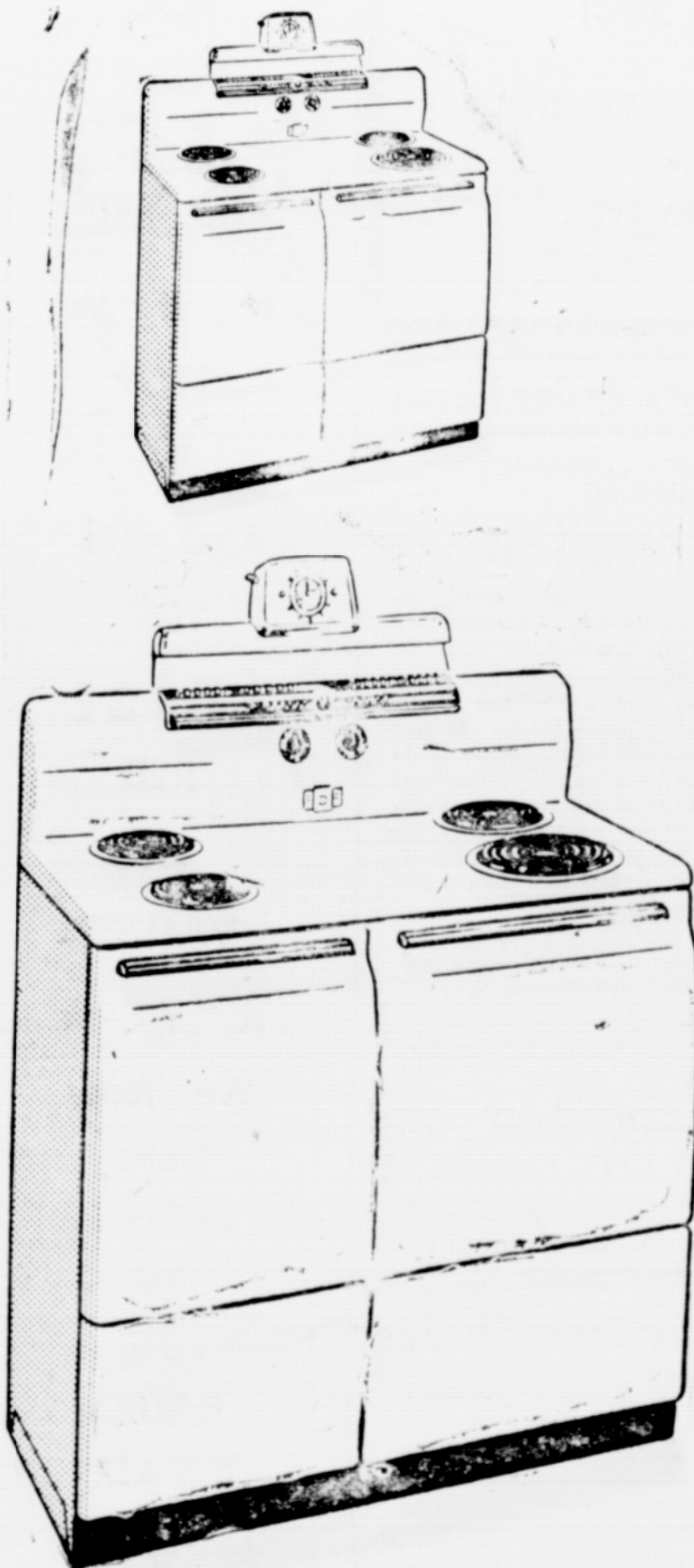

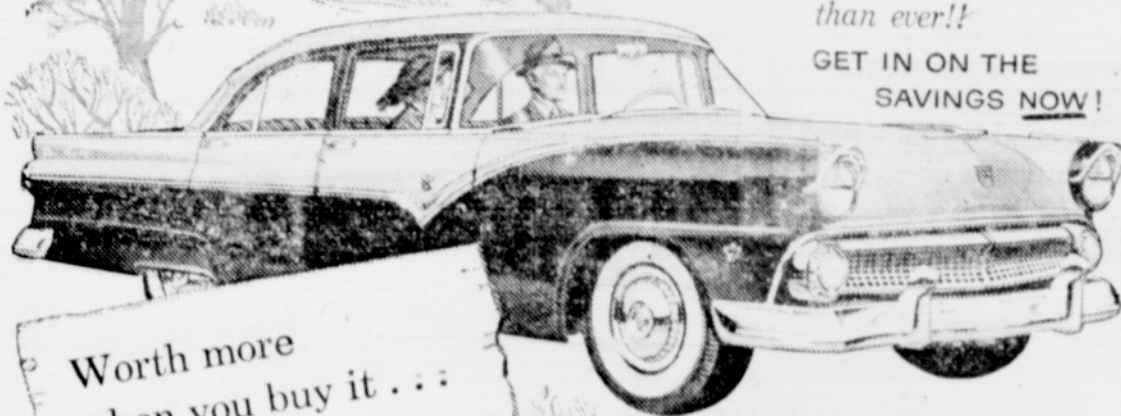
