Missionaries To Be At Baptist Church Soon

On Sunday, March 27, Rev. Reuben Marc, Haiti Missionary, will speak at 11:00 a.m. at the Baptist Community Church. He will be accompanied by Dr. Elmer C. Adams, Executive Secretary of the Oregon Baptist Convention.

Dr. Thorlief Watne, missionary to Ongole South India, under appointment by the American Baptist Foreign Mission Society will speak Tuesday, at 2:30 p.m. to the Women's Missionary Society at the Brookings Baptist Community Church.

Rev. Watne will speak to a general church gathering at 8:00 p.m. on Tuesday evening, showing pictures.

Few men have learned as much about the achievements, problems and opportunities of South India Mission as Dr. Watne has. Mr. and Mrs. Watne were first appointed by the Society in March 1912, and sailed for India the next year. Since January, 1929, they have been at Ongole. As mission secretary, Dr. Watne has the problems of the whole South India at heart.

Born in Norway, Dr. Watne received his early education there. He is a graduate of the Danish Norwegian Theological Seminary at Morgan Park and holds the degree of Doctor of Philosophy. He became a naturalized American citizen in 1913.

Rev. Marc is a native pastor from Port-au-Prince, Haiti, was the subject of a write up in Tuesday's Oregonian. He is the pastor of the largest Baptist Church in Haiti, and is a featured speaker at the Baptist missionary rallies throughout the state.

Rev. Mr. Marc is a personal friend of Haitian President Paul Magloire, and will tell something about his country at the talk Sunday.

Many Baptists from this country will attend the Calvalcade of Missions, featuring Rev. Marc, to be held on Sunday evening, 7:30 p.m. in Grants Pass.

It is the first time that the west has had such a group of missionaries on hand. Nearly 30 missionaries will be at the rallies, which will be held in the First Baptist church.
