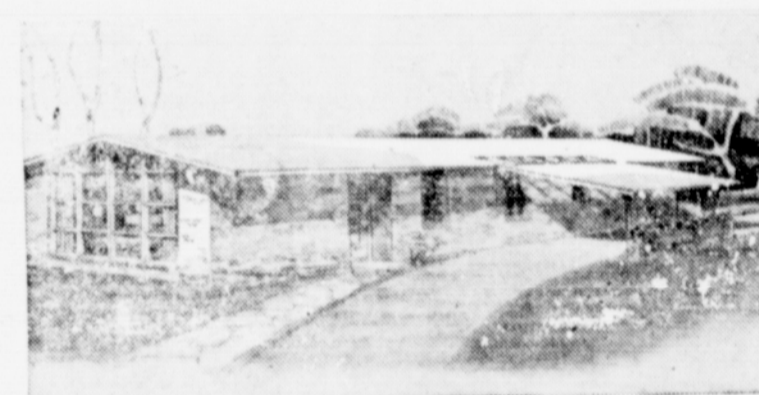

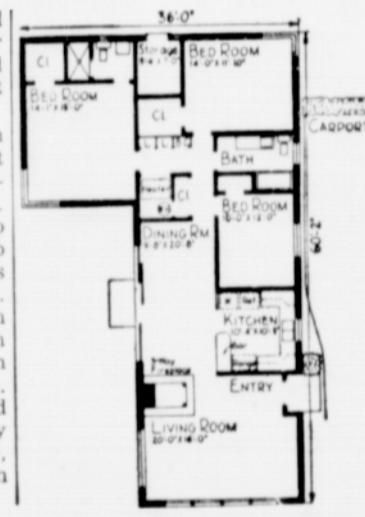
**Plan for Casual Living from Small Homes Guide**

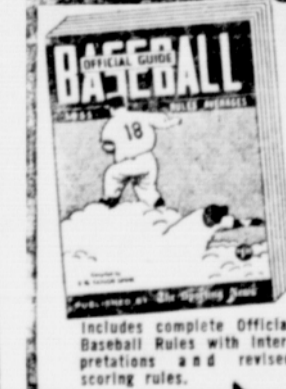

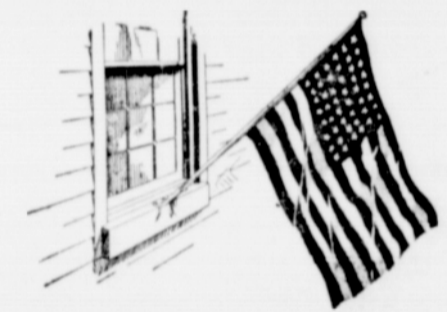
