The Answer Of Easter

"I see my way as birds their trackless path—I shall arrive" so said Browning. It echoes the sublime symphony of Faith. More people think of religion, larger congregations attend church on Easter morning than any other Sunday. It is the triumph of the church. Among the distinctive messages of Easter is the positive affirmation of resurrection and immortality.

Men have always speculated about the meaning of life, and doubtless they always will. At the maternity hospital I have asked, "What is life?" At the morgue I have asked, "What is death?" Even James, who had known the Lord, asked, "What is your life?" It is the brief period of time that God gives us here. Its purpose is the highest possible development of our character, service to our fellows; with kindness and compassion of spirit. There is also given to every man his work. Ourselves then, our fellows, our work, and God.

Birth has but one gate of entrance, death has a thousand exits. Queer, how we shun the subject of death. Every birth carries with it a decree of death. The simplest, most adequate definition of death is that it is the separation of body and spirit. The body is the house the spirit is the tenant. You leave your house to go hence somewhere; you do not cease to exist. "The time of my departure is at hand," says the apostle Paul. A departure, not death, not cessation of existence. "To depart and be with Christ," no terror about that.

There isn't a hair on your head, or a nail on your finger, that you had when you were born. Your body is in a constant state of flux, changing with every breath; in fact it has changed entirely within the past seven years. But like the river that flows with ever changing drops of water and yet maintaining its identity. You are still yourself, the same you that you have always been.

Jesus was very careful on that first Easter Sunday evening, to prove his physical identity to his disciples. Nevertheless, with that resurrected body he passed through closed doors. The angels rolled away the stone from the tomb; not to let the insiders out, but to let the outsiders in. Jesus was already gone.

I am convinced, very deeply convinced, that there is another life beyond our physical sight. On her old coins Spain engraved a picture of the Pillars of Hercules guarding the Mediterranean Sea, with the inscription, "No Plus Ultra," meaning "nothing beyond." Then Columbus pointed his little boat toward the sunset. He saved, communist as well as non-communist world. It is not what found the New World, and Spain revised the motto to read, "Plus Ultra" meaning "More Beyond." The Pilot of Galilee set sail over the seas of God and came back with his chart of eternity. And so men revised their theories of death and departure believed what always had been their hope and cried with certainty of experience, "There is more beyond."

So, again at this Easter time, "the Lord hath begotten in us a living hope by the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible, undefiled, and that fadeth not away, reserved in heaven for us." And if Christ lives, we shall live also.

The most serious thing one can do to his religion is to smother it under littleness. You cannot fence in the Gospel at the limits of your town. You cannot wall in Jesus Christ. God has paid the price of the World's redemption and wants the world saved, communist as well as non-communist world. It is not what it may cost us to do it, but what it will cost us if we do not do it, that should capture our attention. We have been commissioned and empowered to that great task by the power of the living home engendered by a risen and living Lord.

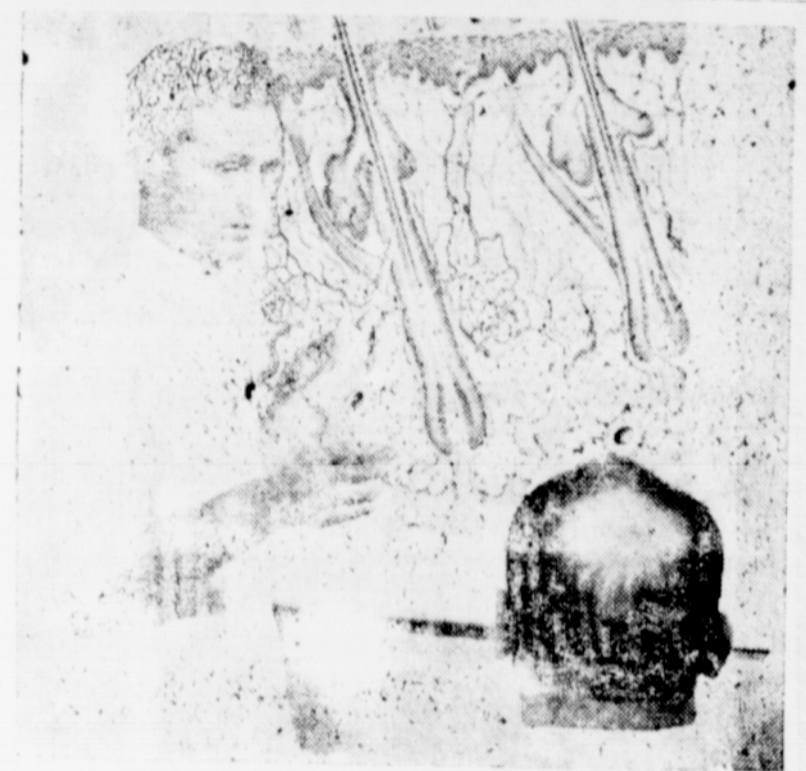
