PLAN TO HOLD SMITH RIVER BOAT RACE ON APRIL 24th

The Smith River American Legion Post 712 are sponsoring the Smith River boat races, to be held on April 24. The General chairman for the affair is James Kellams, assisted by other Legion members.

The rules for the big event are as follows: Skiffs not under 10 feet in length. No hydro-planes. Any certified 16 HP motor, not over 10 cubic pistons, etc. are permitted. A fee of \$25.00 is required for a boat, and optional for one man portage. Contestant must wear regular Coast life jackets for entire race.

Winners will submit to motor inspection by an authorized inspector appointed by the Legion boat committee. Motor must pay for motor inspection to the authorized inspector, if motor is legal. If motor is not legal, owner will pay for inspection.

All judges will be a member of the Smith River Legion post, and all decisions will be final. Entry fee first race, \$15.00; second race, \$10.00. Fee must be paid in by April 17th.

Starting point, first race is Ship A Shore docks up to and around buoy at Jedediah Smith State Park, and back to Ship A Shore. Starting point 2nd race, Ship A Shore, docks up to and around buoy at Bailey Hole and back for five complete laps.

Starting time 1st race, 1 p.m. sharp; second race to start one hour after finish of first race. Same rules apply to both races. Entry blanks may be obtained at Hights Store in Smith River.

Prizes are: 1st race, \$125 and trophy; 2nd, \$75 and trophy. Second race, \$75 and trophy; first, \$50 and trophy. There will also be a carnival, and refreshments at Ship A Shore.

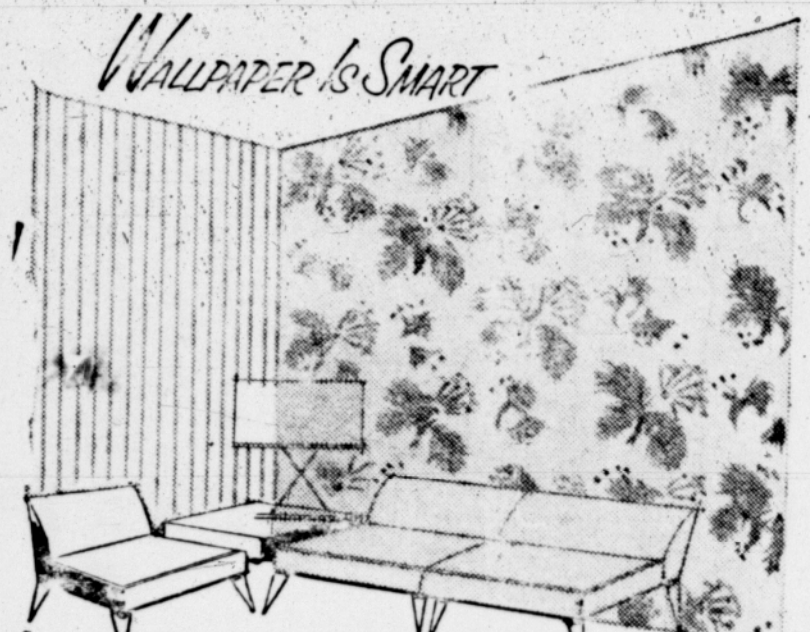

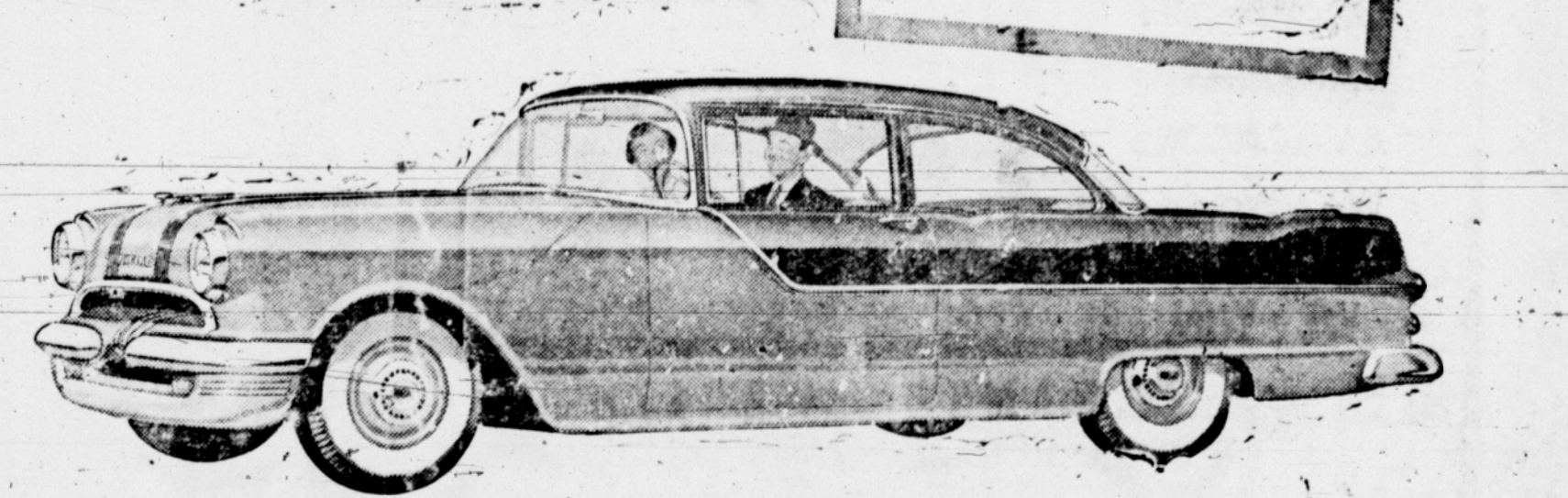
