

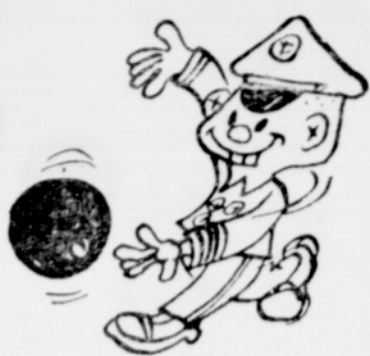
Olsen Hits High Mark

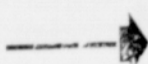
RAINS DELAY BASEBALL TRAINING

SMITH RIVER

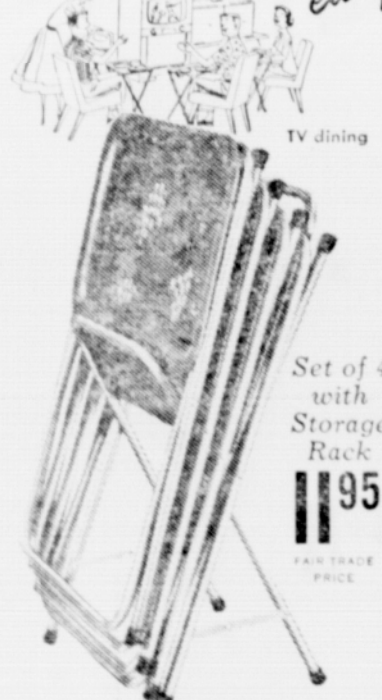
