Brookings Chamber Joins U.S. Group

Businessmen in Brookings have teamed with 1,300,000 others throughout the nation to work for good citizenship, good government and good business.

By joining the Chamber of Commerce of the United States, the Brookings-Harbor Chamber of Commerce takes its place with more than 2,500 chambers and some 450 trade associations in an organization which yields a powerful influence in national affairs, and which will bring to Brookings the advantages of pooled information, ideas and advice about improving the local community.
