National Forest Timber For Sale

Oral auction bids will be received by the Forest supervisor, Post Office Building, Grants Pass, Oregon, beginning at 10:00 A.M., May 27, 1955, for all the live timber marked or designated for cutting and all merchantable dead timber located on an area embracing about 17 acres within Section 19, T. 40 S., R. 12 W., W.M., Mill Creek drainage, Siskiyou National Forest, Oregon, estimated to be 980 M bd. ft., more or less, of Douglas-fir, and 60 M bd. ft., more or less, of western hemlock and other species of sawtimber. No bid of less than \$30.00 per M bd. ft. for Douglas-fir, and \$8.10 per M bd. ft. for western hemlock and other species will be considered. In addition to the price bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.15 per M bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.42 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement, and will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor prior to 10:00 A.M., May 27, 1955. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$10,000.00 must accompany each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of the sale. If an oral bid is declared to be high at the closing of the auction, the bidder must immediately confirm the oral bid by submitting it in writing on a Forest Service bid form for use in submitting sealed bids and full information concerning the timber, the conditions of the sale, and the submission of the bids should be obtained from the Forest Supervisor, Grants Pass, Oregon, or the District Ranger, Brookings, Oregon, before bids are submitted. On Tuesday, May 10, at 8:00 A.M. a forest officer will be available at Brookings Ranger Station, Brookings, Oregon, to explain the conditions of the sale and to conduct a tour to show the timber offered for sale.

In addition to the price bid for stumpage, a cooperative deposit of \$0.30 per M bd. ft., to be used by the Forest Service for paying the cost of slash disposal, and a cooperative deposit of \$0.80 per M bd. ft. to cover the cost of tree planting, seed sowing and timber stand improvement work on the area cut over, for the total cut of timber under the terms of the agreement will be required. As a qualification for oral bidding, all bidders must submit a sealed bid accompanied by the required payment to the forest supervisor prior to 2:00 P.M., May 27, 1955. Sealed bids will be posted at the beginning of the auction for the information of all bidders. \$20,000 must accompany each bid to be applied on the purchase price, refunded, or retained as liquidated damages, according to the conditions of the sale. The first two weeks of the course deals with the theory of Airborne technique and the third week is practical application which consists of leading a group of men from an aircraft while in flight.
Corporal Dirks enlisted in the Army from San Francisco, Calif. in March of 1953 and was sent to Fort Campbell, Kentucky to complete 16 weeks of basic infantry training. 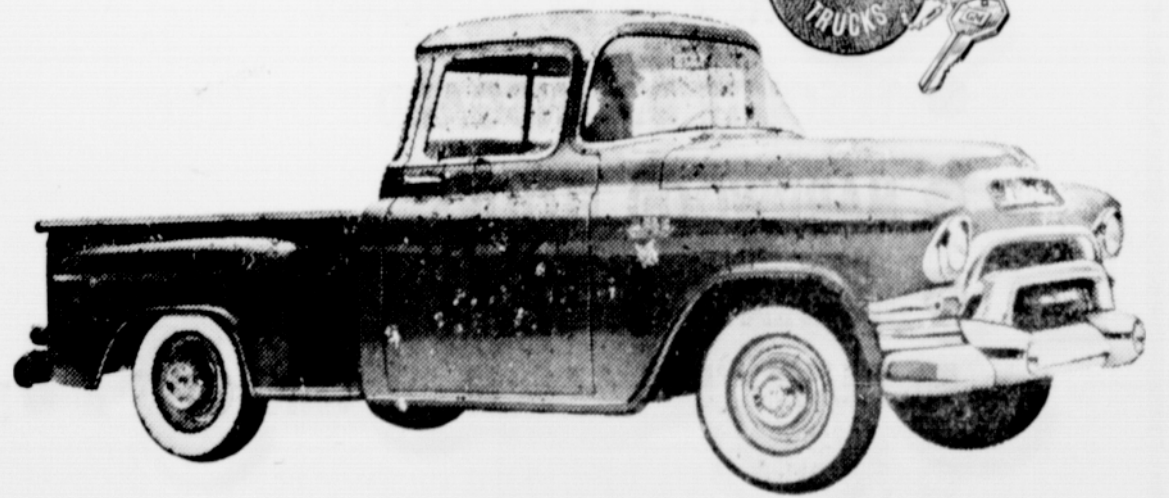

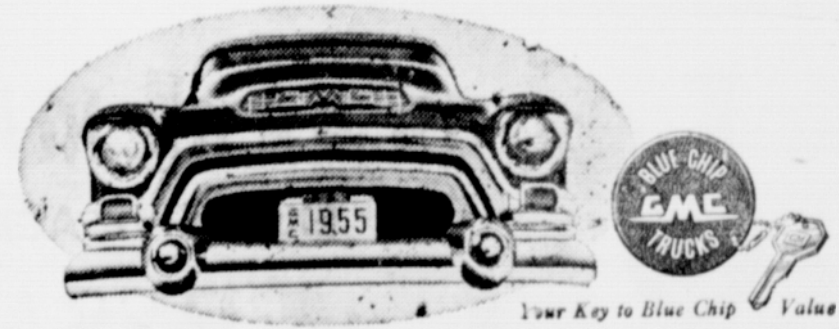
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
