In the Circuit Court of the State of Oregon for the County of Multnomah, Department of Probate.

This matter coming on for hearing upon petition of HERMAN E. HARRIS, the duly appointed, qualified and acting Guardian of the estate of Ida May Harris, a mentally ill person; and

It appearing that heretofore said Guardian has filed herein a petition setting forth the condition of said Guardianship, the facts showing the necessity of selling said ward's interest in the real property described in said petition; and

It further appearing that an order was duly issued out of the above entitled Court in the above entitled cause requiring said ward and the Superintendent of Oregon State Hospital, the person having the care, custody and control of said ward, to appear before the above entitled Court at the Courtroom of said Court at 2:00 p.m. on the 11th day of April, 1955, and

show cause, if any they had, why a license should not be granted for the sale of said real property; and

It further appearing that a citation was duly served upon said ward and upon the Superintendent of Oregon State Hospital, the person having the care, custody and control of said ward, giving notice of the time and place for hearing and citing said ward and the Superintendent of Oregon State Hospital, the person having the care, custody and control of said ward, to appear and show cause why a license should not be granted to said Guardian authorizing said Guardian to sell said real property; and

It further appearing that the original citation, together with proof of service thereof has been duly filed with the Clerk of this Court and that no objections to said proposed sale have been made or presented; and

It further appearing that it is for the best interests of said Guardianship that said Guardian be granted a license to sell said real property at private sale for cash or credit upon such terms as this Court may approve; and

It further appearing that the probable value of said ward's interest in said real property is approximately the sum of \$187.50 and that license should be issued to said Guardian to sell the said real property, and the Court being fully advised;

Now therefore, it is hereby ORDERED that HERMAN E. HARRIS, Guardian of the estate and person of Ida May Harris, a mentally ill person, be and he is hereby authorized to sell at private sale for cash or upon such terms as this Court may approve, the following described real property:

A tract of land lying in the Northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of the Southeast quarter (SE 1/4) of Section Twenty-five (25), Township Forty (40) South, Range Fourteen (14) West, Willamette Meridian, Curry County, Oregon; Beginning at a point which is North 495.0 feet and East 660.0 feet from the Southwest corner of said Northwest (NW 1/4) of Southeast quarter (SE 1/4), said point being the southwest corner of that tract heretofore conveyed to Norman L. Harris and Evelyn M. Harris, husband and wife, by deed recorded December 3, 1949 in Book 34, pages 445-446, Deed Records of Curry County, Oregon; thence East 210.0 feet; thence South 99.0 feet; thence West 210.0 feet; thence North 99.0 feet to the point of beginning.

It is further ORDERED that said real property be sold by said Guardian at private sale to the highest bidder upon notice of said sale being given in accordance with law.

It is further ORDERED that no additional bond be filed by the Guardian herein.

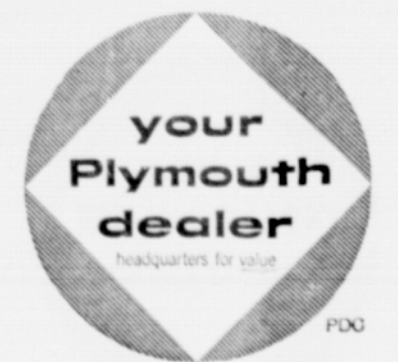
