EASTER SEAL DRIVE IS SHORT

An appeal for persons to respond to the Easter Seals they received from the Oregon Society for Crippled Children and Adults has been issued by Mrs. Glen Rogers, County Chairman, who reported that returns are more than \$40,000 behind a year ago.

Mrs. Rogers said there are many thousands of Oregon residents who have failed to make any re-

turn, and she expressed hope that "a majority of them really intend to do something but just haven't gotten around to it as yet." Returns can be made to Easter Seals, care of the person's local post office.

The fact that Easter is now past doesn't make any difference, Mrs. Rogers stated. "We hope that people will continue to use and buy Easter Seals so that the great work of the society can continue without curtailment."
