TRAFFIC DEATH

RATE DECLINE

Your chances of being the victim of a fatal traffic accident were somewhat reduced in the first three months of 1955, Secretary of State Earl T. Newbry said Thursday.

Mile per mile, Oregon's traffic death rate was 5.7 during the quarter ending March 30 as compared with 6.6 in the same quarter a year ago.

Two factors accounted for the reduction, Newbry said. Fatalities were cut from 83 to 82, while street and highway travel showed an increase. Total motor vehicle mileage is estimated from gasoline sales figures reported to the Secretary of State's office, to which is applied an average miles per gallon figure computed by federal agencies.

The mileage death rate represents the number of lives lost in each 100 million miles of aggregate street and highway travel, safety men explained. It is considered a reasonably accurate indication of a state's traffic death record because it takes into account the amount of driving actually done.

Whether Oregon can continue its reduction as the year progresses will depend on how Oregon drivers fare in the summer travel season, Newbry said. On a national basis, the high-travel summer months have replaced late fall and winter as the most critical period for fatal traffic accidents.

Orlando recently took part in a two-way "Gripe and Growl" dinner staged by the Gourmet Society of New York. Members aired their pet complaints against restaurants, then yielded the floor to an officer of the Restaurant League who had some gripes of his own.

The restaurateur had plenty to say about the patron who shouts at the waiter; the guy with the chip on his shoulder who demands that he sit alone at a table for four; the man-in-a-hurry who orders a seven course dinner and wants it served in twenty minutes.

Gourmets' complaints concerned service and table equipment more than food. "Why—will somebody tell me," Orlando pleaded, "will a top quality restaurant serve a superb dinner in a setting unworthy of the corner hamburger stand? The restaurateur, as I know him, is pretty particular about the clothes he wears."

"He wouldn't think of wearing an unmatched coat and trousers. He feels undressed without an immaculate pocket handkerchief. He always chooses his socks to harmonize with his tie. How can the same man permit his tables to look like a rummage sale—with unmatched silverware, rumpled tablecloth, chipped china and glassware? If his food is good, it deserves a setting that will show it off to advantage."
