INDIAN EDUCATION PLANS ARE TOLD

A representative of the State Department of Education was in the Brookings-Harbor area Tuesday. He reports that his department has contracted to administer a program of education and training designed to help members who are descendants of various tribes, bands, groups or communities of Indians located west of the Cascade Mountains. This program includes sending eligible persons to college business schools, and trade school for vocational training.

Only individuals residing in the state of Oregon are eligible and must submit proof of blood descentancy of being a non-enrolled member of a descendant of a tribe. Full information on this program may be received by contacting Mr. A. H. Wright, Director Indian Education, State Department of Education, Salem, Ore.
