

### BROOKINGS G.O.C. POST COVERED BY OAKLAND AIR FILTER MAGAZINE

The Brookings Ground Observer Post was "Post of the Month" in the "Eyes and Ears," air defense filter center magazine out of Oakland, California.

A full page of news about the post, written by Connie Niemie, was presented in the bulletin.

The Brookings, Oregon (Lima Nector 40 Black) G.O.C. has been functioning for the past year and a half; from the home of Mr.

and Mrs. Bill Hammon. The Post was made ready for occupancy February 21, 1955, and on that day 24-hour sky watches began. The first observers were Mr. and Mrs. Peter Schmidt.

The Post was built by volunteer labor and most of the materials used in the construction was donated or purchased with discount for the local merchants. Several organizations have made donations for the completion of the building.

There are nearly 60 Brookings Civil Defense minded citizens who have volunteered at least four hours a week.

The Post is located on the property of Byron (Roy) Brimm and this is the only Oregon Post who calls into the Oakland Filter Center. This Post is some 375 miles North of Oakland.

Bill Hammon has been appointed Supervisor and his wife Amanda is the Assistant Supervisor. They have spent many hours in organizing and working at the Post. Many thanks are extended to them for their fine work.

The Brookings Post is located about 1 1/2 miles from the city center. The elevation is about 750 feet above sea level, this making it easy to spot planes.

In the near future we will be holding our dedication and by that time we will have named our Post which is high up on a hill, surrounded by azaleas.

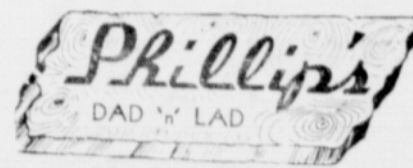
