## HEALTH LECTURES SET FOR AREA CAFE PERSONNEL

The state board of health has announced a series of lectures and demonstrations for restaurant and school lunch program personnel in three Curry County areas May 17-19.

The sessions, designed to assist food service personnel improve everyday sanitation practices, will be held in Brookings, Gold Beach and Port Orford. Instructors will be William F. Bower and Thomas P. Blair of the division of sanitation and engineering of the state board of health in Portland.

Both men have conducted numerous such training programs throughout the state, although they said this would be the first time in "four or five years" classes have been held in Curry county. The sessions will include black light demonstrations to show how easily germs can be transferred.
